First Governor's Notification under Section 16 of Representation of the People Act, dated 16th November, 2021,

followed by Notification No. 322/TL-LC-LAC/2022, dated 16th November, 2021,

- 3. It is also requested that two copies of the State Gazette containing the notifications may be forwarded to the Commission soon after their publication.
- 4. I am to add that under Section 157 of the Representation of the People Act, 1951, the term of office of the member to be elected to the Legislative Council at the biennial election will begin on the date of the publication of the notification, issued by the State Government under Section 74 of the said Act, in the State Gazette.
- 5. I am therefore, to request that three copies of the State Gazette publishing the notification issued under Section 74 of the said Act, may be sent to the Commission for its information.
- 6. You are also requested to bring to the notice of Returning Officer for the said election, the amendments made in relevant sections of the Representation of the People Act, 1951 and forms appended to Conduct of Elections Rules, 1961 including Representation of the People

(Amendment) Act, 2009.

The Representation of the People (Amendment) Act, 2009 - regarding.

Sir/Madam.

I am directed to forwarded herewith a copy each of the Representation of the People (Amendment) Act, 2009 as published in an Extraordinary issue of the Gazette of India dated 23rd December, 2009 alongwith the Notification of the Ministry of Law and Justice appointing the 1st February, 2010 as the date on which the provisions of the said Amendment Act have come into force.

- 2. It may be noted that by this Amendment Act, Section 24 (relating to appellate authority) of the Representation of the People Act, 1950, and Sections 8A(relating to disqualification on corrupt practices), 34 (relating to security deposit), 123(7)(relating to the corrupt practice of obtaining assistance of government servants) of Representation of the People Act 1951 have been amended. In addition, two new Sections 126A and 126B(relating to restrictions on Exit Polls) have been inserted in the Act.
- The important consequences of the amendments are following:
 - (i) Appeal against the order of the Electoral Registration Officer (during continuous updation) under Section 22 or 23 of the Representation of the People Act, 1950 will now lie before the DM/ADM/ Executive Magistrate/District Collector. A further appeal against the order of DM/Collector will now lie before the Chief Electoral Officer of the State. The corresponding amendment to (Rule 27) the Registration of Electors' Rules.

1960 is yet to be carried out. As and when the amendment is made and notified you will informed accordingly.

- (ii) Security deposit for the candidates has been increased to Rs. 25,000/- for Lok Sabha election and Rs. 10,000/- for Assembly election (the rate being half this amount for candidates belonging to SC/ST). Consequently the security deposit for candidates contesting elections to the Council of States and State Legislative Councils will be Rs. 10,000/- and Rs 5,000/for candidates belonging to SC/ST. (vide Section 39 of Representation of the People Act, 1951).
- (iii) Conducting exit polls and publishing/publicizing/disseminating results of exit polls in any manner would be prohibited during the period specified in the new Section 126A. The Commission will issue specific instructions notifying such period during the elections.
- 4. The provisions of the Representation of the People (Amendment) Act, 2009, may be brought to the notice of all election authorities in your State/Union Territory for their information and compliance. All political parties in your State/Union Territory may also be informed accordingly.

THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE (AMENDMENT) ACT, 2009

No. 41 of 2009

[22nd December, 2009]

An Act further to amend the Representation of the People Act, 1950 and the Representation of the People Act, 1951.

Bs it enacted by Parliament in the Sixtieth Year of the Republic of India as follows:---

CHAPTERI

PRELIMINARY

1. (1) This Act may be called the Representation of the People (Amendment) Act, 2009. (2) It shall come into force on such date as the Central Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, appoint.

Short title and commancement

CHAPTERII

AMENDMENTS TO THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ACT, 1950

2. In section 24 of the Representation of the People Act, 1950,

(i) in clause (a), for the words "chief electoral officer", the words "district magistrate or additional district magistrate or executive magistrate or district collector or an officer of equivalent rank" shall be substituted;

Amendment of section 24.

43 of 1950

(ii) after clause (a), the following clause shall be inserted, namely:-

"(b) to the chief electoral officer, from any order of the district magistrate or the additional district magistrate under clause (a).".

Amendment of Second Schedule.

3. In the Second Schedule to the Representation of the People Act, 1950, against serial number 18 relating to the State of Mizoram, in column 7, for the entry "38", the entry "39" shall be substituted.

PART II-

CHAPTER III

AMENDMENTS TO THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ACT. 1951

Amendment of section 8A.

4. In the Representation of the People Act, 1951 (hereinafter referred to as the principal 43 of 1951) Act), in sub-section (1) of section 8A, for the words "as soon as may be after such order takes effect", the words "as soon as may be within a period of three months from the date such order takes effect" shall be substituted.

Amendment of section 34

- 5. In section 34 of the principal Act, in sub-section (1),—
- (i) in clause (a), for the words "a sum of ten thousand rupees or where the candidate is a member of a Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe, a sum of five thousand rupees", the words "a sum of twenty-five thousand rupees or where the candidate is a member of a Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe, a sum of twelve thousand five hundred rupees" shall be substituted;
- (ii) in clause (b), for the words "a sum of five thousand rupees or where the candidate is a member of a Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe, a sum of two thousand five hundred rupees", the words "a sum of ten thousand rupees or where the candidate is a member of a Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe, a sum of five thousand rupees" shall be substituted.

Amendment of section 123

- 6. In section 123 of the principal Act, in clause (7),---
- (i) for the words "from any person in the service of the Government", the words "from any person whether or not in the service of the Government" shall be substituted;
 - (ii) after sub-clause (g), the following sub-clause shall be inserted, namely:--
 - "(h) class of persons in the service of a local authority, university, government company or institution or concern or undertaking appointed or deputed by the Election Commission in connection with the conduct of elections:".

Inscriton of new sections 126A and 126B

7. After section 126 of the principal Act, the following sections shall be inserted, namely:--

Restriction on nublication and dissemination of result of exit polis, erc.

- 126A (1) No person shall conduct any exit poll and publish or publicise by means of the print or electronic media or disseminate in any other manner, whatsoever, the result of any exit poll during such period, as may be notified by the Election Commussion in this regard.
- (2) For the purposes of sub-section (1), the Election Commission shall, by a general order, notify the date and time having due regard to the following, namely:-
 - (a) in case of a general election, the period may commence from the beginning of the hours fixed for poll on the first day of poll and continue till half an hour after closing of the poll in all the States and Union territories;
 - (b) in case of a bye-election or a number of bye-elections held together. the period may commence from the beginning of the hours fixed for poll on and from the first day of poll and continue till half an hour after closing of the poll:

SEC. 1]

Provided that in case of a number of bye-elections held together on different days, the period may commence from the beginning of the hours fixed for pollon the first day of poll and continue till half an hour after closing of the last poll.

(3) Any person who contravenes the provisions of this section shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years or with fine or with both.

Explanation. - For the purposes of this section, -

- (a) "exit poll" means an opinion survey respecting how electors have voted at an election or respecting how all the electors have performed with regard to the identification of a political party or candidate in an election,
- (b) "electronic media" includes internet, radio and television including Internet Protocol Television, satellite, terrestrial or cable channels, mobile and such other media either owned by the Government or private person or by both,
- (c) "print media" includes any newspaper, magazine or periodical, poster, placard, handbill or any other document;
- (d) "dissemination" includes publication in any "print media" or broadcast or display on any electronic media.

126B. (1) Where an offence under sub-section (2) of section 126A has been committed by a company, every person who, at the time the offence was committed, was in charge of, and was responsible to the company for the conduct of the business of the company, as well as the company, shall be deemed to be guilty of the offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly:

Offences by companies.

Provided that nothing contained in this sub-section shall render any such person liable to any punishment provided in this Act if he proves that the offence was committed without his knowledge or that he exercised all due diligence to prevent the commission of such offence.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-section (1), where an offence under this Act has been committed by a company and it is proved that the offence has been committed with the consent or connivance of, or is attributable to any neglect on the part of, any director, manager, secretary or other officer of the company, such director, manager, secretary or other officer shall also be deemed to be guilty of that offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly.

Explanation. - For the purpose of this section, -

- (a) "company" means any body corporate, and includes a firm or other association of individuals; and
 - (b) "director", in relation to a firm, means a partner in the firm."
